Shelter WA is a consumer organisation that represents the interests of low income households on housing issues. **Shelter WA** is particularly interested in the housing needs of:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- Homeless people and those who are at risk of homelessness
- Women
- Youth
- Culturally and linguistically diverse communities
- People with physical, intellectual and other disabilities including people with mental illness and
- Older people

Shelter WA works together with advocacy groups and individuals to promote appropriate, accessible, affordable and secure housing by:

- Representing the interests of low income and otherwise disadvantaged households to government
- Developing policy with input from concerned organisations, advocates and housing consumers
- Providing information and training around housing
- Promoting diverse, affordable housing options

Shelter WA's Management Committee provides corporate governance, strategic and policy direction.

The Aim of Shelter WA

The aim of Shelter WA is the realisation of a housing system that ensures:

- every person has access to affordable, appropriate, safe and secure housing;
- housing provision free from all forms of discrimination
- housing that enhances people's health, dignity and life opportunities
- housing that enables social inclusion and community participation

Shelter WA has operated since 1979 as Western Australia's housing body for community and non-government and low income housing consumers.

Consultations

In order to coordinate and represent consumer's views on housing issues, Shelter WA gathers input from community groups and housing consumers. Shelter WA facilitates and contributes to forums and workshops, conducts consultations with key stakeholders and develops and delivers research, reports and surveys.

Publications

Shelter WA produces monthly updates, quarterly newsletters and prepares papers, reports and information sheets on housing related matters. All of Shelter WA's publications are available on our website.
